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INTRODUCTION

This document is an evidence of the second edition of the event “EuroMed Youth Awards”, after Cairo, Egypt in 2005, held from the 10th to the 14th of June 2013, in Dead Sea – Jordan within the framework of the EU-funded EuroMed Youth and Youth in Action programmes with more than 70 participants coming from **11 European countries** (Belgium, Bulgaria, Cyprus, Greece, Finland, France, Italy, Malta, Poland, Portugal, and Spain), **1 Programme country** of the *Youth in Action Programme* (Turkey) and **6 neighbour countries** from the Mediterranean area (Egypt, Israel, Jordan, Lebanon, Palestine, Tunisia).

The aim of the event was to increase the visibility of the EuroMed Cooperation with key partners from the youth field, to enhance the achievements of the Euro-Mediterranean Youth cooperation by sharing good practices and to give a new impetus for future partnership and cooperation within the future generation of the *Youth in Action* and *EuroMed Youth* programmes.

Among the great amount of applications received, 43 projects took part in the competition (**17** for the **EuroMed Youth Programme** and **26** for the **Youth in Action Programme**) - selected beforehand by the concerned National Agencies of the Youth in Action Programme, the EMYUs (EuroMed Youth Unit) of the EuroMed Youth Programme IV, SALTO-YOUTH EuroMed Resource Centre and RCBS (Regional Capacity Building and Support Unit for the EuroMed Youth Programme IV).

Here you will find out the description of each project which brings out the “all winners” aspect, at the heart of such an event, despite its awarding and thus competitive feature. All

the projects and their representatives deserved their place in this ceremony and thanks to all the experiences they shared, all they worked for, they strengthened the collaboration with the neighbour countries in the Mediterranean Area, making it a place for the union of different people from “this Sea which is joining us together”.

The Youth in Action and the EuroMed projects are gathered together in sequence with the respective logo in the upper right corner.

Among all these projects are the **10** awarded ones in the four categories corresponding to the actions of the *Youth in action* and the *EuroMed Youth programmes*: **youth exchange, voluntary service, seminar** and **training course**. Two of them have been granted a jury special prize for *Supporting peace development process in EuroMed Youth* and for the *Long term strategic approach in a training activity in Youth in action*. The award winners were:

Aim and objectives in details	Participation of young people; Inter-ethnic and inter-religious dialogue; Art and culture; 2008 European year of Intercultural dialogue; Fight against racism and xenophobia; Development of support systems and civil society organizations in the youth field; Disability.

Main outcomes of the project	The Seminar, focused on the “sacrifice” theme in the three monotheistic religions, attended by 10 countries and Muslim, Hebrew, Catholic, Orthodox and Anglican partners. Celebrating 2008 as the European Year of Intercultural Dialogue, participation to the campaign “1001 Actions for Dialogue between Cultures”. Promotion and diffusion of cultural and artistic activities such as theatre, dance and music as tools of peace and respect. Towards an artistic network able to advocate the inter-cultural and inter-religious dialogue and a pacific model for conflict resolution.
Local impact of the project	The project benefited from the patronage of local governments and public authorities. Both participants and local communities benefited from the opportunities offered by the scheduled

	<p>dates, acting as “actors” according to principles of <i>Theatre of the Oppressed</i>. The whole project got enormous exposure and offered a chance to display EU projects.</p>
<p>Sustainability of the project</p>	<p>The sustainability of this project could rely on the support and interest of local government and public institution who were co-promoters of the initial phases (Regione Puglia – Mediterranean, Culture and Tourism Department; Province of Bari; Municipality of Bari; Bari University). Further sustainability was guaranteed by the support of Legambiente network in Apulia which has 54 regional branches.</p>

Aim and objectives in details	<p>- Promote international awareness and education in rural areas of Eastern Finland; inform local youth about international possibilities and encourage them to make initiatives in their local communities; raise awareness of equality and cultural diversity.</p> <p>- Organize an international day for the local youth; make them more aware about international possibilities; make Youth in Action programme more familiar among the youth and youth workers; visit schools and youth houses in the local area.</p>
Main elements of the activity programme	Volunteers organized Poke the Globe!, attended by 250 youngsters from Eastern Finland, during which they were instructing workshops and ran a “Culture Bazaar” presenting their cultures. They interacted with foreign people on grassroots level. Volunteers also visited schools and youth houses in the region, encouraging intercultural dialogue.
Number of participants	16
Main outcomes of the project	For volunteers, living and working in multicultural surroundings helped them accept and understand cultural differences. For local youth, a chance to meet and interact with foreign people and be more open to other cultures. Local youth workers and teachers became more familiar with and were encouraged to use EU's Youth Programme in their work.
Local impact of the project	In 1 month the volunteers interacted with 500 local youngsters giving a positive example of other cultures, helping to break stereotypes and prejudices, and increasing interest in international possibilities. Through this annual event we are doing much needed international education in the region and also building and deepening the network between Metsäkartano and local schools and youth services.
Sustainability of the project	Poke the globe! is organized annually since 2007. The idea of a month long group EVS project around the event came in 2010 when youth workers from Euromed countries were on a study visit in Metsäkartano. The project planning process is done together and there's a common will to continue cooperating. Partners share same values and are experienced in coordinating multilateral projects. Next Poke the globe! will be in 2014 with same partner organizations.

Aim and objectives in details	<p>The general aim of the training course was to promote Human Rights Education through utilisation and adaptation of stories (stories, myths, fables, etc...) as an integral part of heritage within the EuroMed region.</p> <p>The specific objectives of the course were:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. To increase participants’ knowledge and understanding about Human Rights and Human Rights Education 2. To develop skills in storytelling, using voice and language. 3. To identify relationships between stories from different regions of EuroMed and Human Rights values. 4. To identify the possibilities of using stories as a pedagogical tool for Human Rights Education. 5. To create tools which participants can implement in their local realities for Human Rights Education.
Main elements of the activity programme	<p>The course included <i>training sessions</i> on: Human Rights and Children Rights, Popular Literature around Euromediterranean area and Storytelling Techniques – always implemented through non-formal education methodology approach: active, participatory and learner-centered. Participants were also provided with the <i>space to share</i> their own stories, competences and experiences and much learning was based upon that. At the end of the course, participants had the chance to <i>apply everything learnt</i> by two actions: on the one hand, <i>developing in small groups their own stories and Human Rights Education pedagogical tools</i> related to those stories; on the other hand, <i>storytelling in front of the local audience</i>.</p>

Main outcomes of the project	<i>21 new tales</i> as a result of the session “How to create new

	<p>stories” all inspired in one of the Human Rights worked upon in previous sessions.</p> <p><i>5 pedagogical tools for Human Rights Education with children and young people based on stories (new or traditional), created in multicultural and gender-balanced working groups.</i></p> <p>Performance: <i>storytelling session for the local community (around 80 people attended, including families, with children and teenagers).</i></p> <p><i>2 movies summarising the training</i></p>
<p>Local impact of the project</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - <i>Direct impact</i> on the local community of the training place, through the storytelling session - <i>Indirect impact</i> on the local communities of all participants where the tools were used and competences put into practice once the participants went back.
<p>Sustainability of the project</p>	<p>The project is sustainable since it was planned as a <i>long-term training course</i> with three steps. After this first training (Spain), participants implemented the educational activities and used the competences they had developed, as a prerequisite to attend a second training (Jordan), which happened four months later. The team of trainers committed to support the participants after the training in the implementation of the activities in their local realities, which made it possible for many participants to effectively follow-up. Moreover, participants motivation to take part in a second training course, also contributed to their commitment in implementing everything learnt in this first course.</p> <p>These gradual and well-structured processes generated a very motivated and strong group of educators and artists that still now keeps working with motivation on the topic.</p>

Aim and objectives in details	The main objective of the project is to create a platform for discussion, exchange opinions, share good practices in the field to inspire and strengthen youth entrepreneurship. The result of the project is deepen the knowledge and understanding of youth entrepreneurship, exchange of methods and tools to inspire and strengthen entrepreneurship, conference, new opportunities to work with young people, new ideas for projects and, consequently, to give young people opportunities for a better life and better future. The result of the project is also a dialogue, friendship, understanding, close relationships and strong partnerships.
Main elements of the activity programme	Integration, team building, reflection on the youth entrepreneurship – what does it mean for us?, what are the features and the content, identifying barriers and looking for solutions of the youth entrepreneurship, NGO roles in creating and enhancing youth entrepreneurship, conference “Between Arab Spring of changes and European winter of crisis – about youth entrepreneurship”, new ideas and projects

Main outcomes of the project	Common reflection on the youth entrepreneurship The conference “Between Arab Spring of changes and European winter of crisis – about youth entrepreneurship” The movie about the conference with interviews New project, which is the next step: “Culture, society, skills, gender, opportunities – youth in the labour market”
Local impact of the project	Participants prepared the open conference “Between Arab spring of changes and European winter of crisis – about youth entrepreneurship”, which was led by them. It was the opportunity to prepare good and interesting presentation, make a public speech and to tell something about the country, culture, youth. It was a great opportunity to break the stereotypes, to cross the borders, especially for Rybnik citizens who attended in the conference.
Sustainability of the project	We had a good balance between diversity and unity in our thinking and discussions. We created a net of organizations and people who know each other better and trust each other. The project is continued – the next application is submitted and its

	<p>title is “Culture, Society, Skills, Gender, Opportunities - Youth in the Labour Market”. We opened the new fields of reflection on the youth work, youth participation, youth entrepreneurship and the role of NGOs in creating conditions for development. We exchanged tools, methods, ideas and we use them in the local communities. The project had a strong leader, which is a good, sustained organization. We learned a lot from each other but also from the group process which was taking place during the activity.</p>

Aim and objectives in details	The aim of the project was to help the participants to acquire basic entrepreneurial skills. Through different methods and activities, they reflected and explored ways how they can help their organisation to offer young people opportunities to acquire these skills. This course regarded creativity as being an integral aspect of entrepreneurship.
Main elements of the activity programme	The participants tackled different aspects of entrepreneurship with the help of experts who made the participants aware of techniques that can be used to make sure that their youth work practice encourages the learning of entrepreneurial skills by young people. The theoretical aspect was connected to daily time of reflection and put together in a reflective diary. This was also accompanied by sharing of experiences in different aspects of entrepreneurship by people working in business or social enterprises, visits to companies premises and sharing of realities from the respective countries.

Main outcomes of the project	This project helped the participants to: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. understand the basic entrepreneurial skills such as Creativity, risk taking, setting a mission and vision, performing market research, achieving sustainability, time management, budgeting and creating a structure for an organisation; 2. translate these skills which are most often related to business organisations to their NGO and explore ways how they can use them to renovate and increase the capacity of their youth organisations; 3. become aware of different techniques how they and their organisation can offer opportunities to the young people they work with to develop such skills. 4. give a platform for sharing of good practices among the five youth organisations and among the participants; 5. make participants aware of the different and similar realities and challenges that people working in the youth field in different countries have; 6. help the participants become more aware of the opportunities for development in the field through

	<p>collaboration with other countries;</p> <p>7. increase the capacity of the five youth organisations through an increase in the expertise of the participants;</p>
Local impact of the project	<p>The Maltese participants split up into groups and worked with three groups of young people and supported them to plan and implement 3 initiatives. They guide the groups they were working with to develop their entrepreneurial skills and to have a more organised approach to the different aspects of the process of an activity. The participants also worked together to adapt a business plan to be suitable for planning and implementing youth work activities. This was shared with a group of youth leaders during a seminar held between the 9th and 11th November 2012.</p>
Sustainability of the project	<p>The participants planned to disseminate the learning experience and knowledge among other people involved in youth work in their organization. These measures are likely to have an impact on the local communities since the NGOs are working directly in these communities and through this training they are better equipped to help young people from these communities to learn entrepreneurial skills. This will have a long term impact on the communities since it contributes to increase the community youth's ability to start up their own businesses, be more flexible in their careers and to have more tools to face challenges they face during their lives.</p>

Aim and objectives in details	- Develop Solidarity among youth from different cultures to favour inter-religious dialogue - <i>fosters mutual understanding between young people in different countries: hosting Muslim in French families at Christmas time</i> Discuss about issues related to Difference and Acceptance.
Main elements of the activity programme	Different tools were used to talk about differences and stereotypes and to share each other experiences; We did: - 'Albatross' simulation exercise to discover another culture, - the theatre of the Oppressed - the World cafe to discuss about critical topics (impact of religion in the daily life, marriage, religion, homosexuality) the participants were hosted in French families during Christmas period and the last 2 days of the exchange, the were altogether in a big house in Marmande.

Main outcomes of the project	The participants worked together on the concept of difference and, in small groups, they made a collection of stickers to be used on envelops to circulate around the world.
Local impact of the project	The French families who hosted the Lebanese participants discovered a new culture and had an exceptional Christmas hosting a young Muslim at Christmas time.
Sustainability of the project	The stickers made during the exchange were used in several occasions and were posted on a huge number of envelops spread in the world wide. 3 of the French participants went to Lebanon to visit the Lebanese participant that they host at the end of Ramadan period.
